Siri Berg's exhibit displays one design which is also a serial image. Five circles in phases move from a full orange to 3/4 orange with grey, to 1/2 to 1/4, to complete grey against a blue background. Each separate work is a new manifestation of this single design and color.

Art is a quest and Siri Berg explores spatially within a design. Many methods are employed: isolation of a part, or dividing into three or five panels, or varying the scale, etc. What does it reveal? The exploration is the artist's and the viewer's experience.
